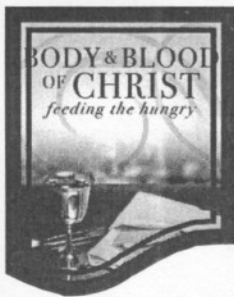


BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST
JUNE 6, 2010



Today's celebration reminds us of the mystery of the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, the major source of ongoing nourishment and strength for all believers. In this sacrament, the Lord continues to meet us, swell with us, and fulfill God's promise to be with us always.

Have you ever visited a "Bed and Breakfast"? It is place were travelers can stay at, if it is a good place, promises a clean place, a good night's sleep and a good meal to begin the day. In short, rest and sustenance.

For us as a Catholic community of faith, as we celebrate this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, are offered an going opportunity for rest and sustenance with the Lord in our reception of the Eucharist.

Prayer Service

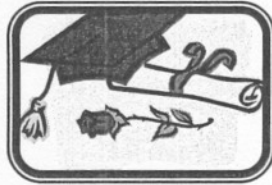

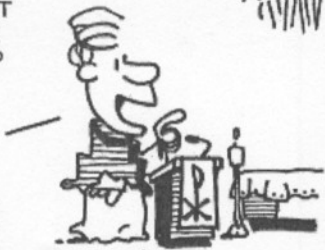
